

Modern Slavery Policy

In performing its obligations, Power On Australia, will ensure that all employees and each of its related bodies corporate will:

- Comply with all Modern Slavery Laws; and
- Take reasonable steps to ensure that there is no Modern Slavery in Power On Australia or its Contractor's Personnel, supply chains or in any part of their business or the supply chains of any related bodies corporate or in any part of their businesses.

Power On Australia will comply (*and ensure that all Personnel and related bodies corporate*) with any reasonable requests made by its clients for assistance, for the provision of information or documents as required by its Clients to enable its client's own compliance under or related to Modern Slavery Laws.

Power On Australia will immediately give written notice to its clients if it becomes aware of a possible, potential, suspected or actual breach by it or its employees of any Modern Slavery Law.

Power On Australia represents and warrants that neither it nor the companies' employees or related bodies corporate:

- Have been convicted of any offence involving Modern Slavery; and
- To the best of its knowledge, having made reasonable enquiries, have been or are the subject of any investigation, inquiry, or enforcement proceedings by any Government Agency regarding any offence or alleged offence of, or in connection with Modern Slavery.

Power On Australia agrees to implement due diligence procedures for its own suppliers, subcontractors, and other participants (*together with other processes, procedures, investigations, and compliance systems as deemed necessary*) to ensure that there is no Modern Slavery incorporated into any supply chain or other part of the business.
